




A WORD FROM EASTON

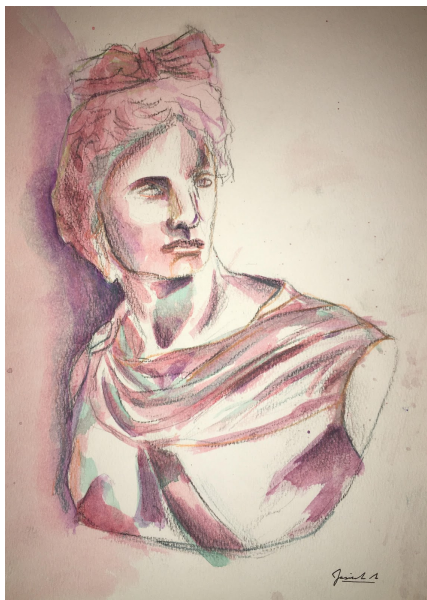

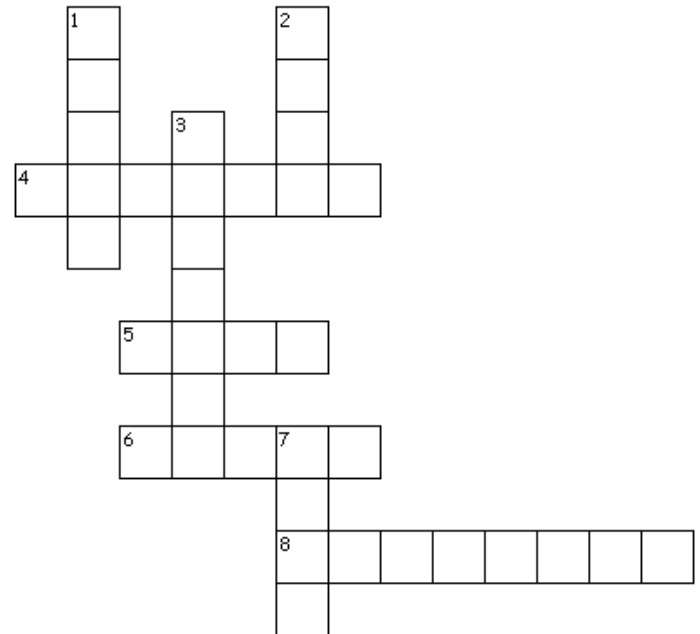
